

By: Asia Citro


In this silly and fun book, a group of pigeons fly in and out of each scene. Children will have fun counting the pigeons as they come and go on each page.

A young child asks, "How many are in my pond?" as a turtle, fish, frog, dog, and other animals




jump in and out of her pond. Bright, colorful illustrations and simple text encourage children to practice addition and subtraction as animals come and go from the pond.




Caps for Sale

This classic tale is about a peddler who keeps a stack of caps on his head as he sells them throughout town.


One day he takes a nap under a tree and some playful monkeys take all his caps! Children can talk about subtraction and addition as the peddler loses his caps and gets them back.
