


## BOOKS

By: Anna McQuinn



By: Helen Oxendine



By: Katie Cleminson



By: Emma Chichester Clark


One day a bear finds a book under a tree and wants to learn to read, but who can help him? This is magical book of friendship, a love of reading and a girl who is strong and brave.
