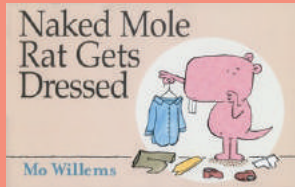

### Naked Mole Rat Gets Dressed

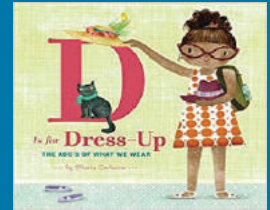

### D if for Dress-Up – The ABC's Of What We Wear

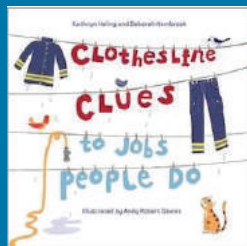

By: Kathryn Heling and Deborah Hembrook

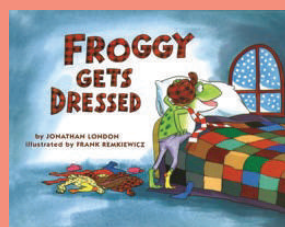
